The City of Tallahassee is pleased to submit the enclosed Transportation Alternative Set-Aside Application for grant funding for sidewalk installation along Blountstown Street. 

B. Project Narrative And Engineers Opinion of Probable Cost

Blountstown Street Sidewalk Improvement Project Narrative

(1) SAFETY

The city is applying for a Transportation Alternatives Project Set-Aside for construction of a sidewalk within the Blountstown Street transportation corridor from West Tennessee Street (U.S. Hwy. 90) to West Tharpe Street (C.R. 158). This 3,600 L.F. sidewalk project is located along a minor arterial corridor roadway in need of a sidewalk for pedestrians who are currently using the unimproved shoulder (See photo right). The project would greatly increase the safety for pedestrians by providing a safe and partially protected route with the addition of curb and gutter, 6-foot wide sidewalk or grass strip area with 5-foot wide sidewalk with curb and gutter, and marked crosswalks at all side street intersections. Because Blountstown Street accommodates bus routes for four (4) Leon County Schools, Sabal Palm Elementary, Griffin Middle School, Godby High School and Sail High School this sidewalk will allow safe travel for students of all ages to school bus stops along the corridor. In addition, this corridor



is within walking distance to several Leon County Schools including the Teenage Parent Program and Second Chance/Ghazvini Learning Center. It is also within walking distance to both Tallahassee Community College and Lively Vocational Schools providing a safe pedestrian path for many additional users.





(2) CONNECTIVITY

The proposed sidewalk will provide a vital link for multimodal transportation opportunities because this corridor accommodates Star Metro's Forest Route including three (3) bus stop locations on the west side (southbound) of the road and four (4) on the east side (northbound) side of the road for a total of seven (7) stops along the entire corridor. The Forest Route is StarMetro's third best perfomring route and as such, runs buses every 30 minutes Monday-Friday and every hour on Saturday. In addition, it will provide pedestrians with a safer route to West Tennessee Street where there are two (2) existing Star Metro Bus Stops on the Azalea Route. The Azalea Route is the major east-west connector provides access to CCNW and Commonwealth Drive area, C.K. Steele Plaza downtown where routes from all over the city converge for transfers, as well as Fallschase on the east side of town.





(3) ACCESSIBILITY

The surrounding area is generally a blue collar working class lower income area with multiple mobile home communities, one section eight housing development, small single family detached homes and townhouse communities anchored on each end by commercial and industrial zoned properties. The current zoning along the corridor includes:


The area on West Tennessee Street at Blountstown is zoned CP, Commercial Parkway, while the Tharpe Street area at Blountstown is zoned M-1, Light Industrial. With all the residential areas situated between these two anchors it seems likely that the sidewalk would provide pedestrian accessibility for residents who work within walking distance of their employer. In addition, this route provides access for at least one individual utilizing a wheelchair and one using a walker as shown in the photograph to the right.



The public will derive enormous benefit from this project. From the picture below you can see the existing trail where pedestrians are already walking this corridor on a daily basis. A new 6-foot wide sidewalk adjacent to a raised curb and gutter will greatly enhance the pedestrian route in this



corridor. In areas where right-of-way is plentiful there will be a 5' wide sidewalk with grass strip between the back of curb and the sidewalk. The width of any grass strips would be determined after survey is complete and the drainage design has been incorporated. (See Appendix C for Concept Plans)



Existing site evaluation shows three existing sections of sidewalk along the west side of the roadway. One section south of Allison Marie Court is 105 feet long, the second section north of Nekoma is approximately 245 LF while the third section at Westgate Ct. is approximately 160 LF. These sidewalks are 5-foot in width with a 6-7 foot separation from the travel lane without curb and gutter. (See photos below) Any existing ditches or swales will be closed to make way for the sidewalk. This will also benefit the pedestrians greatly along this corridor and encourage more usage of the sidewalk when it is completed.





(5) REGIONAL PLAN

Since December, 2010, Public Works has applied various criteria to aid in ranking potential sidewalk-installation projects both for citizens' safety and to enhance the general quality of neighborhood life. In 2014, Public Works (now Public Infrastructure Engineering), together with the Planning Department, worked for several months to update the evaluation criteria used to prioritize sidewalk projects. We began with projects identified on the 2010 Planned Multimodal Project List. The City Commission considered the initial draft of the updated prioritization process on September 10, 2014.

During that Commission meeting, there was considerable discussion of the need to assess both existing and potential demand. Commissioners also emphasized the need to incorporate recognized community priorities into the process, such as access to transit and Placemaking.

Public Infrastructure Engineering now maintains an identified project list for sidewalks throughout the City which ranks sidewalks based on multiple criteria. These criteria include access to transit, placemaking, roadside safety and access, safe routes to schools and pedestrian demand. A given project is scored based on the individual roadway's unique characteristics and then added to the list based for their final score. The sidewalk list will be updated yearly; additional locations will be added over time based on input and concerns received from the public.

The list was reviewed and modified in January of 2018 and Blountstown Street currently ranks 30th out of 191 on the Tier One (highest priority) projects list.

(6) PROJECT CONSTRUCTABILITY

If the CRTPA and FDOT approve this project design can begin immediately with construction in FY2019 or 2020 based on the time it takes for survey and design. The existing right-of-way width along this corridor is 66 feet (See Appendix C) and sufficient to accommodate, at a minimum, a 6-foot wide sidewalk adjacent to the back of raised curb and gutter. Once survey is complete there may be areas where the city could implement their preferred typical section which includes a 3.5' wide grass strip. The drainage component must be considered before making the final decision on the ability to include grass strips as well as their width.

(7) LEVERAGING OF FUNDS

The City is prepared to cover the cost of the design and permitting (See Appendix A) for this very important and much needed sidewalk project. In addition, StarMetro is committed to adding three bus shelter/bench combinations and two stand-alone benches as well as trash receptacles at each location provided there is sufficient right-of-way and no drainage conflicts. The addition of these amenities would be funded by StarMetro. The city, through the use of consultants, or by using inhouse staff can complete the design in a timely manner to ensure the project is ready for construction by FY2019/2020. The City is more than willing to enter into a LAP agreement for this project.

(8) COMMUNITY SUPPORT

This sidewalk project has received public support in the past by way of inquiries to the City's digitally app that allows citizens to report anything related to city infrastructure and utilities. Anything from a pothole, to the need for sidewalk, water leaks and downed powerlines can be reported using the app. To date there have been three digitally reports concerning the lack of sidewalk along this corridor or lack of maintenance of the existing segment of sidewalk. In addition, StarMetro has received email correspondence about the need for bus stop pads and benches or shelters. (See Appendix D)












BLOUNTSTOWN STREET SIDEWALK CONCEPTUAL LAYOUT



E. Public Support

StarMetro stops on Blountstown Highway

StarMetro provides service on Blountstown St. between Mission Road and Tennessee Street via the Forest route which runs Monday through Friday on a 30-minute frequency and Saturday on an hour frequency. The Forest route is StarMetro's third best performing route averaging over 200,000 trips per year. Because of the lack of sidewalks and to accommodate the demand for transportation from our customers, StarMetro maintains seven stops on this corridor which is less than 3/4 mile long (three northbound and four southbound). StarMetro's standard practice is to place stops 1/2 mile apart.



StarMetro has received multiple requests for bus stop amenities to be installed along this corridor; however, due to the lack of accessible sidewalks, StarMetro has been unable to fulfill these requests. With the addition of sidewalks, StarMetro would look to add three shelter/bench combinations and two stand-alone benches as well as a trash receptacle at each location. Having sidewalks installed on this corridor will allow StarMetro to provide a much safer service to our customers.

I apologize, I have been working on a few projects and am completing another clinical rotation. Since I am not in Tallahassee, it would be best to continue the correspondence between Andrea Rosser, Casey Mason and Dr. Alexander as they are all in the same city. However, I can share the experience of attempting to navigate how to add a bus stop to the neighborhood of Maryland Oaks Crossings (3103 Bicycle Road, Tallahassee, FL 32304).

For many years there were two obvious issues with the infrastructure, 1) speeding traffic through the neighborhood and 2) no physical bus stop for the community members, only a designated corner.

After successful completion of adding speedbumps to the neighborhood, I attempted to find ways to add a bus stop. I began with you, Eddie, at which time you gave me an individual's phone number. After multiple voice messages, phone tag, and referrals to other phone numbers, I was unable to get a clear answer on if this addition would be possible. From my understanding, in order to add a bus stop would require an addition of a sidewalk, which seemed to be a difficult task. I was preparing for my board examinations and a geographic change, and progress on this project stopped.

Unfortunately, I cannot find my notes on the individuals who I called, neither their names of phone numbers. But the community members have shared with us on multiple occasions how difficult it is for them to roll their wheelchairs onto the grass, next to one of the water-catching-ditches, to wait for the bus. Especially during the rainy season.

I hope this helps and that we can make something happen for the community!

Please let me know if you have any questions. The individuals in Tallahassee are very dedicated to this community and have full support from the College of Medicine.

We will keep everyone posted.







The City shares your concern regarding the lack of sidewalks on Blountstown Street, as well as numerous other locations throughout the City. To address these areas, we have established a prioritized list of potential sidewalk installation projects that would enhance the non-vehicular mobility of our citizens. The City Commission approved the first version of this list in April 2015 and most recently revised it February 2016. You can learn about the process from this page (and the pages it links to, including the current list itself): http://www.talgov.com/you/you-sidewalk-prioritization.aspx

According to that list, we currently DO have an identified project for sidewalks on Blountstown Street. As you can see, this list is extensive (currently including nearly 300 projects). Blountstown Street is currently #30 on the list, based on multiple criteria.

As of now, unfortunately, there is not enough funding available to construct all of the projects on the list. As projects are completed and when additional funding becomes available, we will attempt to address the backlog of other identified projects.

I know this is not the answer you were hoping for. It is frustrating for us as well to not be able to commit to meeting all of the identified needs in a more timely manner.
