DRAFT FISCAL YEAR 2012– FISCAL YEAR 2016 TRANSPORTATION IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM (TIP)

STATEMENT OF ISSUE

Consistent with state and federal requirements, the DRAFT Fiscal Year (FY) 2012 – FY 2016 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) (*available for review on the agency's website: www.crtpa.org*) has been developed for Capital Region Transportation Planning Agency (CRTPA) transmittal to the Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) for review.

RECOMMENDED ACTION

Option 1: Recommend CRTPA transmittal of the DRAFT FY 2012–FY 2016 TIP to the Florida Department of Transportation for review.

HISTORY AND ANALYSIS

One of the annual requirements of the metropolitan transportation planning process for the CRTPA is the development of the Transportation Improvement Program (TIP). Developed by the CRTPA in accordance with 23 U.S.C. 134(h), 23 CFR 450 and Chapter 339.175(7), F.S., the TIP identifies regional transportation projects (roadway, bicycle and pedestrian, transportation systems management, transportation enhancement, public transportation, aviation, resurfacing and bridge projects) that have received funding in the Florida Department of Transportation's (FDOT) Five-Year Work Program.

The purpose of the TIP is to inform the public and governmental agencies of transportation projects (planning through construction) for all modes that have received funding during the next five-year period (FY 2012 – FY 2016) within our region (Gadsden, Jefferson, Leon and Wakulla counties).

Projects contained within the DRAFT FY 2012 – FY 2016 TIP include those projects that were presented to the CRTPA Committees on January 4, 2011 by the staff during presentation of the FDOT Tentative FY 2012– FY 2016 Five-Year Work Program. WOODVILLE HIGHWAY SOUTH CORRIDOR STUDY

STATEMENT OF ISSUE

The Woodville Highway Corridor Study was studied as two projects over the past several months: the Woodville Highway (South) project, which begins at Capital Circle, Southeast in Leon County and terminates at US 98 in Wakulla County, and the Woodville Highway (North) project which begins at Gaile Avenue and terminates at Capital Circle, Southeast.

The purpose of both Corridor Studies was to assess the existing conditions along the corridor from many different perspectives that range from transportation, land use, utilities, and parks and recreation, while developing solutions for future needs along the Woodville Highway Corridor. Each project is unique in that the respective segments have a wide range of opportunities and constraints that need to be addressed to ensure that the existing issues are addressed while contemplating the future.

At this time, the Woodville Highway (South) Corridor Study, performed by Vanasse Hangen Brustlin, Inc. (VHB), will be presented to the CRTPA Subcommittees. Information that was gathered through interviews, data collection, and the Charette that was held in September of 2010, will be presented for CRTPA subcommittee consideration and approval.
