PROJECT DESCRIPTION

This project consists of the addition of paved shoulders to the 8.9 mile segment of CR 158A (Old Lloyd Road), from US 90 to SR 59. CR 158A is a major collector in Jefferson County that receives substantial daily traffic of which 10 to 15% is daily truck traffic. Currently, the travel lanes are narrow and no shoulder is present. Because of these existing conditions, the roadway presents a hazard to all types of the traveling public. The addition of 4 foot paved shoulders to the roadway will provide additional warning time to drivers wandering from the travel lane and will decrease the overall number of crash incidents on this roadway, while at the same time providing pedestrians and bicyclists additional refuge while traveling along this corridor.










